



## Activity brief for parent

### What is Plastic Hunting?

Plastic Hunting is an outdoor activity where children explore their surroundings and discover how plastic waste ends up in nature. Equipped with litter pickers and gloves they hunt for litter around the school or in a nearby park.

This hands-on activity helps children see how small actions can make a big difference. And that it is fun to take responsibility together!

### Is it safe?

Yes. The activity is guided by Plastic Whale Rangers together with school supervisors.

Students work in small groups and stay within a safe area selected by the school, such as the school surroundings or a nearby park.

### What if the weather is bad?

Plastic Hunting takes place outdoors, so children should dress for the weather. In case of severe weather conditions, we will contact the school to arrange an alternative date.

### What happens to the waste?

The collected waste is sorted together with the children.

This helps them understand how recycling works and how waste can become a valuable resource.
